## 2 ☐ What is reflection?

- Reflection is one way to show evidence of thought - it lets the reader know your brain is working
- Reflection tells the reader why something is important or significant
- Reflection gives you, the writer, a chance to think about the information you have gathered
- Reflection is all about YOU!

- *Columbus would have certainly needed to show strength and courage in front of his crew*
- *Columbus' actions were copied by other explorers, leading to the loss of many native cultures.*

Using the negative is NOT good reflection:

- *If Columbus hadn't landed in the Caribbean, there would still be Arawak living there.*
- *This is important because without Columbus we wouldn't have Columbus Day, or Columbus, Ohio.*
- *This is significant because if Columbus had landed in Maine instead, he would have brought lobster back to Queen Isabella and she might have been allergic and then would have had Columbus killed for trying to poison her.*
